Her mother's work in the textile industry exposed her to an array of stylized figures, shaping her understanding of composition and movement. As she refined her skills, she turned to dynamic subjects—sports pages from newspapers and the Olympics -where the fluidity of human motion and the intensity of facial expressions became a central focus in her art. This pursuit of understanding the human figure through various poses and emotions laid the foundation for the themes she would later explore in her professional career. Beyond the technical aspects of representation, Dede's early interest in body language

and expression fueled her curiosity about human psychology and philosophy. While she

initially engaged in teamwork-based activities during her youth, her intellectual

inclinations gradually shifted toward deeper inquiries into identity, subjectivity, and the complexities of the human experience. These themes would later surface in her artistic exploration, as she sought to dissect the connections between internal emotions and external presentation. Her art became an avenue for tracing her own presence within broader existential questions, a pursuit that continues to define her creative output. Before fully committing to an artistic career, Dede followed a different academic and professional path. She first completed her studies at the Vocational School of Social

Sciences, where she specialized in foreign trade and teamwork dynamics. For a decade,

she balanced a corporate career in foreign trade with her love for painting, dedicating her weekends to artistic expression. Eventually, the joy she found in creating art outweighed the stability of her professional role, leading her to take a decisive step toward her true calling. She left her job to pursue a formal education in painting, enrolling at Marmara University's Department of Painting. During her third year of undergraduate studies, she participated in an Erasmus program at Accademia di Belle Arti L'Aquila in Italy, further expanding her artistic perspective. Graduating with honors in 2008, her academic journey continued with a PhD at Yıldız Technical University, where she deepened her engagement with art and design research.





## extends beyond traditional techniques, incorporating a diverse range of materials and conceptual frameworks. Whether working with acrylics, watercolors, or oils, she infuses


her compositions with a sense of movement and depth, often experimenting with unconventional textures such as buttons, rope, gauze, and handwritten text. These tactile elements introduce layers of meaning, transforming her pieces into intricate dialogues between materiality and concept. Her engagement with digital media and video art has expanded her creative possibilities, allowing her to merge photography, drawing, and animation into cohesive visual narratives. Utilizing tools such as Photoshop and Procreate, she reinterprets her paintings into digital compositions, sometimes developing them further into animated

sequences using After Effects. This synthesis of traditional and contemporary methods

reflects her ongoing interest in evolving artistic forms, ensuring that her work remains dynamic and relevant in an ever-changing visual culture. Her experiments with video date back to her student years, and in 2016 and 2017, she ventured into underwater photography, capturing ethereal imagery that introduced new dimensions to her practice. Through her multimedia explorations, Dede engages with complex themes such as gender, consumer culture, identity, posthumanism, and migration. Her work often interrogates the fluidity of identity and the ways in which individuals navigate personal and societal constructs. The objects she selects—such as buttons and bandages—serve as metaphors for connection, fragmentation, and healing, embodying unresolved narratives within the human experience. By bridging physical and digital realms, her art

While she has experimented with plexiglass, engraving, and various mixed-media techniques, her current focus remains on painting and digital transformation. Her ability to seamlessly transition between traditional and digital mediums highlights her adaptability and curiosity. Whether working on a canvas, a digital screen, or a video composition, she




